Who We Are...The Housing Department is responsible for:

- Administering all housing programs and services
- Providing sufficient, affordable, appropriate housing to Members
- Maintaining the value of Garden River's housing stock
- Delivering housing education to Members, Tenants and Homeowners; and
- Implementing and enforcing the Housing Policy and other housing related by-laws, policies, plans and agreements.

# What is the Difference between "Rent to Own" and "Rental"


**Rent to Own:** subsidized through Canada Mortgage Housing Corporation (CMHC) Section 95 Program which are mortgaged through GRFN and managed by a Contribution Agreement. Garden River retains ownership of these units and Certificate of Possession (CP) on which each unit is located until the Tenant has paid the mortgage in full.

- Should a Tenant have arrears owing on the unit after the mortgage has amortized, the CP will not be transferred until paid in full.
- Do you have arrears? Contact the Housing Department to inquire

**Rental:** Units owned by the GRFN and made available as rental housing to Garden River Members through Rental Agreements. In some cases, a Garden River Rental House may be made available for purchase to a qualified Tenant through a "rent to own" agreement.

## WHAT IS OUR COLLECTION RATE OVER THE PAST THREE YEARS?

Through the dedication of the Housing Department staff and the increase in support of our tenants, we have achieved 97% rent collection as well as the reduction of historical arrears.



Rental collection is important to you as well! Did you know that rental payments pay for:

- House insurance on all units
- Mortgage payments to CMHC to safeguard all other programs and services offered by the Housing Department
- Maintenance repairs



#### **Tenant Content Insurance**

Protect your belongings by purchasing tenant content insurance! In the case of a fire, flood or other emergency in your home. The GRFN Housing Department is not responsible for damages to your belongings. Valid tenant content insurance is mandatory under your signed rental/lease agreement.

# Your Outdoor Space

*is Yours...* clean yards are your responsibility and by making a few changes, you can help keep your community clean:

- If screen doors or windows need to be fixed or replaced (not considered tenant damage) contact the Housing Department
- Do your part to keep the garbage enclosed and stored in appropriate bins
- Do not put carpet on your decks...it can damage the wood and mold may form

#### Maintenance Check List:

#### November

Check attic

- Inspect floor drains
- Clean range hood filter
- Replace/clean furnace filter
- Check teleposts
- Check for condensation and humidity

#### December

Check air ducts

- Check snow on roof
- Replace/clean furnace filter
- Clean range hood filter

Clean humidifier

#### January

- Replace/clean furnace filter
- Check furnace fan belt
- Inspect oil furnace blower
- Check water heater
- Check exhaust fans
- Clean range hood filter

## Warm up to Winter Savings

- In the winter, set your thermostat to 20 °C when you are home and 18 °C overnight or when away.
- A clean furnace filter will help your heating system work better, use less energy and last longer. Clean or replace furnace filters once a month during heating season.
- Add weather stripping to doors and windows to reduce heating costs by up to 30 per cent.
- > Wrap your electric hot water tank with a blanket.
- A heavy-duty outdoor timer will automatically turn your seasonal lights on and off.
- > Close heat registers in rooms you're not using.
- Open blinds during the day and close them at night.

## Union Gas Home Weatherization Program Update

• In March 2017, the GRFN Housing Department in coordination with Union Gas held a community presentation for the Home Weatherization Program which was free to our Members. The Home Weatherization Program will help you save costs and save energy and our Members received free energy efficient products such as, shower heads, energy efficient tap aerator nozzle and foam wrap for pipes. These kits will be distributed at a later date. The GRFN Housing Department visited 127 units in September and August out of the 156 applicants with "A" Audit Blower Door Test.

#### WILD RICE CASSEROLE

1 cup wild rice
 1/2 cup white rice
 3 stocks celery
 1 onion small
 1 cup carrots cut small
 1 cup cauliflower cut flowerettes
 1 cup broccoli cut flowerettes
 2 gloves garlic
 1/2 walnuts or shaved almonds
 1 can Campbell's chicken soup
 1 package of ground chicken
 1 cup vegetable broth
 Soak wild rice over night: cook se

Soak wild rice over night: cook set aside Cook white rice: cook set aside Cook chicken until cooked set aside Sauté onions, carrots, celery, garlic, cauliflower, broccoli; add cooked chicken; add can of Campbell soup; add vegetable broth; simmer 10 min.

Then add cooked rice Wild and White. Mix together and add all content to casserole dish. Mix in grated cheese mozzarella (optional). Cover with tin foil.

Lightly grease casserole dish add all content bake 350 degrees for 30 minutes. Remove tin foil bake uncovered 10 min.
